### NIABI ZOO OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MINUTES FROM JUNE 12, 2017

**PRESENT:** Committee members –J. Craver, L. Jackson, T. Brahm, W. Nelson, J. Taylor, M. Byrne.

**ABSENT:** T. Jarrett.

**ALSO PRESENT:** Kai Swanson, Forest Preserve District President; Jared Miller, Zoological Society; Lynsey Engels, Zoological Society; Chris Townsend, Zoological Society; Scott Lohman.

Chairman Taylor called the meeting of the Niabi Zoo Oversight Committee to order at 5:01 PM on Monday, June 12, 2017, in the Education Room of the Administration Building at Niabi Zoo in Coal Valley, Illinois.

Roll was called:

L. Jackson, T. Brahm, W. Nelson, M. Byrne, J. Taylor, J. Craver.

Total Present 6

T. Jarrett.

Total Absent 1

Chairman Taylor stated that the discussion of the MOU would be moved up on the agenda to accommodate Ms. Engels' schedule.

Mr. Byrne stated that last meeting there was a lot of back and forth on what percentage of the memberships the Society would be receiving. I don't believe there has been discussion on that in the interim.

Mr. Jackson confirmed there has not been discussion on that since the last meeting.

Mr. Byrne stated that this had been a discussion for the last three months, and then wondered if just going with a 50/50 split for the time being would be a good option so that the MOU could just be done and the Oversight Committee could move on to the new board. Then the new group could tackle the MOU next year.

Mr. Jackson stated that that would likely make things worse in the future. If this isn't settled now, then it's going to be a point of discussion for the next five years. I see no reason why this can't be settled sooner than later.

Mr. Byrne stated that he didn't want to see it delay the creation of the advisory board.

Mr. Jackson asked why Mr. Byrne felt that the MOU was delaying the advisory board.

Mr. Byrne answered that the MOU discussions tend to take longer during the meetings than the discussions for the advisory board. The only thing that we're stuck on is how much money the Society is going to get from admissions. The Society is willing to give up the carrousel. I think we should be concentrating on the advisory board and what steps will move the zoo toward getting back the AZA accreditation.

Mr. Jackson stated that Niabi's relationship with its support organization is an important part to accreditation. The current MOU which was up in February, which the District and Society are still working under until a new agreement can be reached, is not in Niabi's best interest. That is why it needs to be resolved sooner rather than kicking it down the road yet again.

Mr. Craver stated that President Swanson made a request last month in regards to the split/shared funds, he said that the commission would expect a plan for those funds that the District is providing the Society. According to the current agreement, the District needs to put the Society on notice that we're wanting to modify or terminate the current agreement.

Ms. Engels stated that she felt this was the same conversation that keeps happening. The Society feels that it can't move forward until we know what's going to happen with the advisory board. We know there's potential for that to pass, but has it passed yet?

Mr. Nelson stated that it is on the agenda today for approval.

Mr. Byrne stated that he thought it went to the Commission last month.

Mr. Craver stated that the Oversight Committee agreed on the details of Community Advisory Board resolution at the last meeting, and the Executive Committee sent it to the State's Attorney's Office for review. The State's Attorney's Office gave an opinion, which was that the resolutions itself should not include the bylaws. That resolution was edited to create the advisory board, and will be presented to the Forest Preserve Executive Committee at tomorrow's meeting. Providing the resolution is passed, the bylaws, that have already been agreed upon by the Oversight Committee will be presented the meeting after.

Mr. Byrne asked to clarify that tomorrow, hopefully, the resolution will be approved to setup the board in concept, and then the details as to what that board will do will come a month later, or two months later?

Mr. Craver stated that that lead to the question of, if this board is going to dissolve in a month or two, what needs to be accomplished beforehand?

Mr. Jackson asked how this affected the issue of the MOU and fund raising.

Ms. Engels stated that the Society felt it was hard to put on a fundraising event without being able to tell donors and sponsors what the plan for the zoo is. It's hard to get sponsorships and get going when we don't know for sure what's going to happen in the future.

Mr. Byrne stated that he could understand that. The Society wants to know, what is the Community Advisory Board? Is it coming about? What is it going to do? So that they can decide what they're going to do, and work with the board on it for fundraising.

Mr. Jackson respectfully disagreed stating that at this point there are eight or nine things that have been identified that Niabi wants to do. If we focused on one or two of those and setup a Zoofari or other fundraising event, I think we could still move ahead while this other work takes place. What I'm hearing is that we have no plans in 2017 to do any of that.

Mr. Byrne stated that he thought that was true because the Society didn't have people who had the energy or desire to put in the time that it would take to put on an event like that unless the Oversight Committee gets "our thing" together.

Mr. Jackson stated that he was not negating that perspective of how the world works, but sharing his own perspective. However, the fact is that Niabi is open, Niabi is running and popular. We can raise money. Ninety-nine point nine percent of the people, in my view, don't care what the people in this room are talking about.

Ms. Engels stated that she saw things just the opposite.

Mr. Townsend stated that the Society had spent a lot of time and money on the feasibility study that says people don't want to give to the zoo without knowing what going on. As far as the MOU goes, over the last several years the Society has gotten less funds from inside zoo operations. Every time the MOU has changed, another zoo operations revenue stream has been taken away. Now you're wanting to take more. It doesn't seem like we're going to resolve this between these two groups since the District won't budge on this issue, which is fine with me I'm out the door anyway.

Mr. Jackson asked, if we can't resolved this, then what are we doing?

Mr. Townsend stated that the District never budges, and the Society never gets anything.

Mr. Jackson asked what Mr. Townsend wanted to get.

Mr. Townsend stated that wasn't saying get, but that they wanted to keep [inaudible].

Mr. Byrne stated that everyone seemed to be in agreement that the carousel should be turned over to Niabi, and that, if memory served, the debate last meeting was if the Society would receive a fixed dollar amount from the zoo or if the Society would receive a percentage of the memberships.

Mr. Jackson stated that the amount that came from Mr. Ferrell was \$35,000.00.

Mr. Byrne suggested that, just for this fiscal year, to give in, and transfer the carousel to the zoo, and do the fifty/fifty split with the memberships. Then the Advisory Board can look at this issue.

There was a brief discussion about what happened at previous meeting of the Oversight Committee.

Mr. Nelson stated the discussions last month had been put on hold so the Society could decide on what amount they felt they needed as seed money for fundraising, and we're still hearing that you don't know.

Mr. Byrne asked if everyone was in agreement for the carrousel to be owned by the District. I think it does.

Mr. Craver stated that the District is fine with assuming ownership of the carrousel.

June 12, 2017

Mr. Byrne asked what was wrong with compromising on the fifty/fifty split now, and letting the Community Advisory Board work on negotiating the percentage. That way we can move on.

Mr. Jackson stated that unless this issue was decided this time around, the issue would continue to be a problem well into the future.

Mr. Nelson stated that he would like to move on with the MOU and Advisory Board with the caveat that there are still items in the MOU that need to be decided. We seem to have reached a stalemate.

Mr. Jackson felted that the stalemate has happened because nothing of substance gets said in these debates. All that gets said is that people are upset and they're not going to stay. But then we sit here like this and don't talk about any of the underlying issues. That's why I want to hash through and settle something, because we'll be doing this three years down the road if we keep this up.

Mr. Nelson stated that he felt that there had been a lot of work done on putting together the recommendations and on the MOU. I'd like to send the recommendation of the Advisory Board and MOU on to the Forest Preserve Commission with the understanding that we still have work to do on the carrousel and the split.

Mr. Brahm stated that a recommendation for the Advisory Board had already been passed on to the Commission.

Mr. Craver stated that was correct, and the State's Attorney's Office had recommended that the document be split into two document. One is the resolution dissolving the Oversight Committee, and the second would be bylaws. Nothing is changing within the articles that had been recommended by the Oversight Committee, those have all just been pulled out and put into a separate document.

Mr. Byrne asked if the modified document was what was going to the Commission this month for approval.

Mr. Craver stated that it was.

Chairman Taylor asked to confirm that it was going in front of the Commission for action, or only for discussion.

Mr. Craver that it was going to the Commission for action. Is there a specific time frame that the Oversight members would like to remain? Obviously it's going to take time to choose the members, and get them in front of the board to be approved. So will it be sixty days, ninety days, or the end of year?

Mr. Byrne stated that he didn't want to wait until the end of the year, but July might not be enough time for the new members to be chosen.

Mr. Craver stated that the articles could be passed as soon as August, and the appointments would be August at the very earliest.

Chairman Taylor called for a motion to approve the consent agenda items, except the budget reports, which there were questions about.

**MOTION:** Mr. Byrne moved to approve the consent agenda items, except the budget reports. Mr. Brahm seconded the motion.

Motion carried.

Chairman Taylor called for a motion approving the minutes from the May 8, 2017 meeting.

**MOTION:** Mr. Craver moved to approve the minutes from the May 8, 2017 meeting. Mr. Nelson seconded the motion.

Motion carried.

Chairman Taylor called for discussion on AZA accreditation.

Mr. Jackson stated that he had sent out copies of the materials to get members familiar with the process. There's nothing this group can do right now in regards to that.

Mr. Byrne stated that when he was reading through the materials, it seemed that the articles that were decided on last month for the Community Advisory Board fit in well with the AZA requirements. Does Mr. Jackson agree with that assessment?

Mr. Jackson stated that he did agree that the bylaws would fit in, and shouldn't cause trouble in regards to the AZA accreditation. There are mentors that Niabi can get from other institutions that can come in and help us through the process, which staff does plan to utilize.

Mr. Byrne asked if it would be beneficial to have a mentor look at the governance model before that process is started.

Mr. Jackson stated that they would only look at the bones of model, not the specifics. There are broad parameters that have to be adhered to, but there are many variations on the specifics of those models. The governance model is not a concern, but the support organization piece is what concerns me.

Mr. Byrne asked to clarify that that would be the MOU.

Mr. Jackson confirmed that the MOU is what he was referring to, which is why he was so adamant about getting that completed.

Chairman Taylor called for discussion on the summer planning session. There had been a vision that it would include the members of the Community Advisory Board, is that still the feeling of this committee?

Mr. Brahm stated that the new members should definitely be a part of the planning.

There was general agreement to that statement.

June 12, 2017

Chairman Taylor called for discussion on the Season Pass update.

Mr. Jackson stated that staff was looking at comparisons. Since Niabi opened this season, we've brought in \$60,810.19 on the memberships.

Mr. Byrne asked how that total compared with last year.

Mr. Jackson stated that he didn't have the exact numbers for last year, but sales have been up across the board.

Mr. Brahm stated that on the budget performance report there was a significant difference between the anticipated and the actual.

Mr. Craver went through the revenues, the estimating process, and that the revenues are very weather dependent. Then stated that there have been more people getting the passes, and that is broken out differently than the way admissions are broken out.

Mr. Byrne asked if the shortage would create any issues.

Mr. Craver stated that it would not, and that the District uses a modified accrued accounting system. He went on to explain some of the various revenue sources for Niabi, and went through some of the savings that Mr. Jackson has managed.

Mr. Brahm asked if a fiscal year 2018 budget had already been presented.

Mr. Craver stated that it had, and explained the budget process.

Chairman Taylor called on Mr. Jackson for his director's update.

Mr. Jackson read some of the highlights from his written report, and encourage the Oversight members to visit Niabi and see the new exhibits and animals that have arrived since the members began nearly two years ago.

Chairman Taylor asked President Swanson if there was anything he cared to share.

President Swanson spoke briefly on the meetings that are being held at the District facilities this summer.

Chairman Taylor asked the members of the Society if there was anything additional that they would like to add.

There was not.

Chairman Taylor asked the Oversight Committee members if there were any other questions or comments.

There was not.

There was one request for public comment by Mr. Scott Lohman.

Mr. Lohman stated that the frustration that both sides are feeling will continue until there is constant communication. This was the first good discussion on the budget. I go to both meetings, and it doesn't even sound like it's the same meeting. There is more information in the Executive Committee meeting packet for finances of the District. It's just about sharing information with this group and the Society. There are different reports in the Forest Preserve Executive Committee packet than in the Oversight Committee. Also, it was said that most people don't care what is said at these meetings, but when talking about the donating community, I disagree.

Chairman Taylor called the meeting adjourned.
